The next Suburban Acres Civic League Meeting will be September 8, 2008

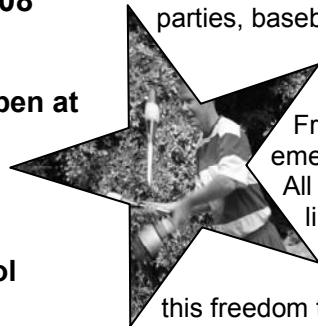

Suburban Acres Civic League Meeting Minutes for June 9, 2008

Meeting called to order at 7 p.m.

Treasurer's Report: Bruce reported that we now have a total of 58 members. For the period March, April and May 2008 we received \$618 in income and had expenses of \$308.99. The bank balance as of the June meeting is \$1,241.35.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM: Officer Sandy Parker gave a brief overview and distributed handouts regarding the implementation of a Neighborhood Watch Program. When we are ready to begin the program, Officer Parker will again meet with us.

PACE REPORT: Officer Bev Hubbard encouraged everyone to participate in the next Citizen's Academy that will begin on August 28th. Applications were provided.

Crime statistics for May 2008: 500 block of Suburban Parkway—paintball vandalism; 100 block of Fife Street—residential burglary; 7400 block of E. Kenmore—residential burglary and stolen auto.

NORFOLK COLLEGIATE: Mr. Will King briefed the civic league on the school's plans for a new fine arts center. Construction will begin in early 2010 and should be completed by early 2011. The center will have a 450 seat theater as well as additional classrooms. Drawings were presented for review.

UPCOMING EVENTS:

Yard of the Month Program – beginning in July, our newly formed committee will be awarding a Yard of the Month "Mermaid" to one of our many beautiful yards. Be on the look out for your neighbors "Ruby and Rita" who head this committee. The mermaid was made by our own Jack Sanderlin of Suburban Parkway.

4th of July Parade – This year's parade is sure to be a huge success. We have extended our route to include Carl and Brickby Streets. Tim distributed a map showing the parade route. We will return to the school for light refreshments. We will meet at Suburban Park Elementary School at 9:30 a.m. The parade will begin at 10:00 a.m.

THOLE STREET MEDIAN UPDATE: Tim Fox reported that the bid has been selected and should be approved by the end of this month. Work is slated to begin in August.

MEDIAN MERMAID PROPOSAL: We are considering different versions and locations for a neighborhood mermaid. The fiberglass-type can range in price from \$2,000 to \$4,000. We will need to consider various fundraising projects for this initiative.

CIVIC LEAGUE MEETING FREQUENCY AND LOCATION: A proposal for more frequent meetings of the civic league was presented. The following suggestions have been made:

1. meet all months except January, July, August and December
2. meet bi-monthly and
3. meet monthly

A proposal to have meetings at the Work Force Development Center was also presented. These proposals will be brought before the civic league for a vote at the September meeting.

Let's shed a light on crime prevention

Over the past few months, there have been break-ins, lurkers, continued larceny from autos, and murders within the general Wards Corner area, with some of this occurring here in Suburban Acres! We as a community owe it to us, our families, and our neighbors to strengthen our watch efforts and build a "safer" neighborhood.

Simple precautions can help prevent the spread of crime that is rampant in this area. One thing we ALL can do is start with the basics, like porch lights for example. When several lights are out, our streets become a haven for individuals to commit crime, sight unseen. It has long been suggested that this simple act of precaution may be all it takes to thwart a

would-be crime on your property. Our large properties and beautifully treed lots render unlit porches nearly invisible in the darkness, inhibiting our ability to look out for one another. If we all commit to lighting our porches in the evening, it would shed more than a little light on the situation.

Let's not give criminals the chance to hide in the darkness of our streets. It's a small step in the direction of preventing unnecessary crime within our community. We have a way to go in eliminating crime altogether in Suburban Acres, so let's start by doing our part to prevent some of the petty and potentially dangerous crime beginning at our front door. Suburban Acres Neighborhood Watch Program To Begin

At our June meeting, Officer Sandra Parker from NPD Crime Prevention Unit spoke about Neighborhood Watch and how we could start up our own program. Several people expressed interest in the program and as a result, we'll be forming a planning committee to get our Neighborhood Watch Program underway.

JoDee Cook has volunteered to be "Watch coordinator" to help lead the group. Additional roles include "Block captains" to represent individual blocks, and "Block watchers" to provide the eyes and ears for the neighborhood.

Norfolk takes action against graffiti

Norfolk has established a graffiti abatement program called TAG-OUT. This program will be piloted in the area of the city with the highest concentration of graffiti.

Our neighborhood does not experience a high incidence of graffiti and we are not in the designated pilot area for the Tag-Out program. However, it is still important to report graffiti to police. The culprits are usually 12-24 years old, usually nonviolent, and their main crime is vandalism. They commit this crime for the rush, attention, recognition, and act of doing something illegal. They usually operate alone.

Gang members may also participate in graffiti as a message to other members and gangs. For this reason, it is important to report graffiti to the police as soon as possible.

The TAG-OUT program will work directly with concerned residents, business owners

and community-based agencies to identify, report and remove graffiti from public and private spaces.

At present, Norfolk will employ a mobile graffiti unit and painting contractor to assist in the removal of graffiti in the pilot area only.

All graffiti should be promptly removed within 24 to 48 hours to significantly reduce the chance of reoccurrence. City ordinance requires that a private property owner must remove graffiti within five days of the Notice of Violation. The property owner may be entitled to an incentive payment of up to


\$50 for removal materials.

Know Your Flag Etiquette

The flag should be displayed on all days when the weather permits, especially on legal or other special occasions. It is customary to display the flag from sunrise to sunset on building or on stationary flagstaffs in the open. However, on special occasions it may be displayed at night, preferably lighted. A citizen may fly the flag on any day he wishes.

How to fly the flag

The flag should be raised and lowered by hand. Never raise the flag while it is furled; unfurl, then hoist quickly to the peak of the flagstaff. It should be lowered slowly and ceremoniously. The flag should never be allowed to touch anything beneath it, such as the ground.

Disposing of worn flags

Every precaution should be taken to prevent the flag from becoming soiled. When a flag is in such a condition, through wear or damage, it is no longer a fitting emblem for display. It should be destroyed privately in a dignified matter.
