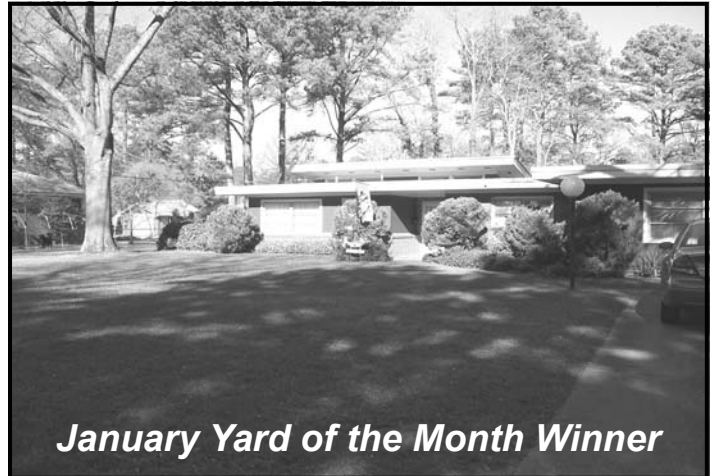

Reduce the likelihood of becoming a *carjacking* victim by following these crime prevention tips

Although most of us feel secure traveling in our vehicles, *carjacking* has become a community concern with potentially high consequences. Everyone is vulnerable because it is a crime that is not limited to time of day, location, or type of vehicle. Carjacking has become a violent crime of opportunity for drug users and other criminals. You can reduce the likelihood of becoming a victim by following these crime prevention tips.

Tip #1

Keep your vehicle locked at all times! Carjackers usually target unlocked cars with unsuspecting motorists. A running vehicle is an easier target because many theft deterrent features are disengaged at this point.

Tip #2

Be aware of your surroundings when approaching your vehicle! Scan the area and promptly move to your vehicle with your keys in hand. Check the back seat before getting in. Pay special attention to suspicious individuals loitering around your vehicle as well as any occupied vehicles nearby. Do not approach your vehicle until these suspicious individuals leave the area.

Tip #3

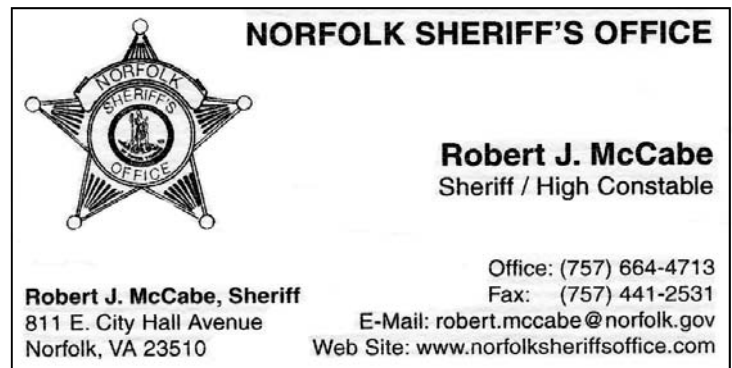
Be aware of your surroundings when you are driving! Maintain plenty of room between you and the vehicle in front in the event that you have to maneuver quickly. Never stop to assist strangers. You can call for assistance for them without stopping your vehicle. If you become involved in a suspicious traffic accident, do not exit your vehicle to check the damage. If you are in an isolated area, consider motioning to the other driver to follow you to a nearby gas station, police station, or other well-lit public place. If you feel like you are being followed by another vehicle, do not drive home. Call 911 and advise them of the situation.

Tip #4

Be aware of your surroundings when exiting your vehicle! Stay extra vigilant when parking. Scan your surroundings

before exiting your vehicle. Keep your doors locked until you have scanned the area and are ready to exit your vehicle. Park in well-lit areas near main aisles and walkways, away from dumpsters, wooded areas, vans, or other large vehicles that obscure your view and could possibly conceal suspicious individuals.

Tip #5

Always pull into your driveway front first, so your headlights illuminate the area in front of you.

What to do if you become a victim

Try to remain calm. Avoid verbal and physical confrontation. Do not resist. If your child is in the vehicle, tell the perpetrator that there is a baby in the car. Never attempt to reach for your purse or glove box as the perpetrator may think you are reaching for a weapon. Try and get a good description of the perpetrator, including height, weight, sex, age, and complexion.

Remember, *carjacking* can be deadly as well as dangerous. Your vehicle can be replaced, but you cannot! The Norfolk Police department wants you to stay alert, vigilant, and safe.
